2019 Annual PAC Contribution

You work hard to provide important health care services for your patients and good jobs for your employees. Protect your business by donating \$365 (just a dollar-a-day) to IPA's political pac IPA-RxPAC-NJ. **If pharmacy owners don't make annual PAC donations, PBMs will use that to their advantage and push their anti-independent pharmacy agenda through political means.** With prior member donations IPA and our pharmacy coalition partners made MAC transparency and PBM licensing the laws in New Jersey.

2018 Victories & 2019 Goals to End PBM Abuse:

January 2018 PBM Licensing: The new PBM licensing law, P.L.2017, c.383, is a big step forward to end PBM abuse. For the first time, this law gives the state regulatory authority over PBMs. PBMs will have to meet minimum standards in order to apply for NJ licensure. We are now working with our pharmacy partners and the state on the enforcing of the law to end PBM abuses for pharmacies and patients.

August 2018 NJ Medicaid Win: The NJ Independent Community Pharmacy Coalition had a huge victory when Medicaid began enforcing the Medicaid Managed Care contract and the MAC law. Pharmacies across the state have been reversing and resubmitting OPTUM Medicaid Managed Care claims.

September 2018 PBM Law Compliance: The state issued a bulletin on compliance with the state's MAC transparency and PBM licensing laws. The bulletin requires PBMs to complete a licensure application as an organized delivery system. It also states that PBMs must begin providing specific wholesaler availability information to pharmacies during the MAC appeals process, and it reminded them that carriers cannot require patients to use mail order.

September 2018 Effective Rates & PBM Fees: NJ Assembly bill A3717, which would end retroactive PBM fees in commercial, NJ Medicaid and the State Health Benefits plans was amended and passed out of the Assembly Financial Institutions and Insurance Committee and has moved to the Assembly Appropriations Committee for consideration.
